WHAT

Team USA Ringette has been representing the red, white and blue at the World Ringette Championship for decades. This year's team will be decided following Team USA Ringette's Final Selection Camp taking place for the first time ever in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in partnership with Aston IceWorks July 28th to 30th. Prospects will come together from across North America to fight for their place on the 2017 team and for the chance to play at the 2017 World Ringette Championship in November. All ice times being open for viewing to the general public.

The weekend will finish off with a free 'Skate with Team USA Ringette' session where the general public can meet player prospects, learn about the sport and even play in a game alongside team alumni and prospects. This will all take place on July 30th from 11am-12pm on rink 3.

The World Ringette Championship will take place later this year from November 27 – December 3 in Mississauga, Ontario, Canada. Six (6) Countries from around the world will meet and compete for gold in ringette, the fastest game on ice! At the last World Championship in Finland (2016), Team USA placed fourth against Sweden.

Ringette is similar to ice hockey in many ways: the game's objective and the number of players on the ice. Ringette uses of a ring instead of a puck, and a straight stick without a blade. It has similarities to the rules of basketball, lacrosse and hockey.
